



SDG Progress 2024 in Asia-Pacific














Critical drivers of vulnerability in the Pacific SIDS and beyond










(1) Policy coherence






Figure 4: Means of Implementation Tools











Pacific Perspectives 2023: Advocating the aspirations of Small Island Developing States


