## **Background**

As countries implement substantial COVID-19 recovery packages, it becomes increasingly important that these measures also promote financing and investment opportunities in sectors that help build economies to become more resilient to future shocks, are socially inclusive, and are ecologically sustainable. To support this challenge, and in preparation for the 2023 High Level Political Forum (HLPF) on Sustainable Development in 2023, a series of five sub-regional forums were held which discussed the progress of SDGs 6 (clean water and sanitation), 7 (affordable and clean energy), 9 (industry, innovation, and infrastructure), 11 (sustainable cities and communities), and 17 (partnerships for the goals).

The Subregional Multi-Stakeholder Forums on the Implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals provided governments, development partners, civil society, academia, the private sector, and other stakeholders opportunities to share subregional perspectives, discuss collaborative measures to address subregional priorities, and exchange good practices to achieve the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

This session will feature the outcomes from the five subregional forums, including the actions and plans of governments, perspectives of subregional organizations, and voices of stakeholder groups.
