

Summary of UK Census designs (1)

- UK: England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland
- 3 separate censuses
 - England and Wales Office for National Statistics
 - Scotland National Records of Scotland
 - Northern Ireland Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency
- Harmonised designs, but used administrative data differently
- England, Wales and Northern Ireland: Census March 2021
- Scotland: Census March 2022

Summary of UK Census designs (2)

- Address frame
- Self-response (primarily online, paper available)
- Field follow-up to prompt response (respondents still self-respond)
- Post-enumeration survey to assess coverage and adjust for non-response using a dual system estimation model
- Results published from June 2022 onwards

Plans v reality

- Examples of uses in the standard design
 - preparing for collection
 - quality assurance/validation of final estimates
 - estimating the population in communal establishments
- Preparation to use in contingency situations
 - including scenarios of low response overall
 - in particular areas
 - for certain population groups
- Being prepared to use for other contingencies



Examples of uses of administrative data (1)

- QA showed estimates to be implausible for ages 0-2, in every area
- Used administrative sources to calibrate our dual-system estimation (DSE) model estimates

Births and deaths data, health data used as upper limit

Examples of uses of administrative data (2)


- COVID pandemic impact on Higher Education students studying from home or at education institution
- Guidance given to students to respond for their education institution location, if they still had a contract to live there
- Requested Halls of Residence records on number of students who had contracts to live there
- Used to estimate numbers who should have responded

Halls of Residence administrative data on contracts

Examples of uses of admin data (3)

 Alternative Household Estimate (AHE) is an independent calculation of occupied households to check dual system estimation (DSE) assumptions

 Majority of areas were very close to AHE, used as further evidence to users of validity of final data



Learning from Census 2021 (1)

- Be prepared
 - Get data ready in advance
 - Don't underestimate preparation time requirements, acquisition, engineering, platforms, access
 - Don't underestimate data complexities georeferencing, matching and linkage
 - Prioritising which sources and aspects of sources are most useful is difficult

Learning from Census 2021 (2)

- Circular use: if use in preparing data, beware how you use it to validate the same data
- The importance of accurate linkage
- Covid impact
- Admin data quality caveats
 - Currency
 - Coherence
 - Addressing and georeferencing
