





# Almost 40% of LNG trade moves through South China Sea

The South China Sea is a major route for liquefied natural gas (LNG) trade, and in 2016, almost 40% of global LNG trade, or about 4.7 trillion cubic feet (Tcf), passed through the South China Sea




#### Total losses by top 10 regions 2011-2020 and 2020

The port safety is not well monitored but some indicators on maritime shipping should be considered

South China, Indochina, Indonesia and Philippines remains the top loss hotspot of the past decade. This is driven by a number of factors including high levels of local and international trade, congested ports and busy shipping lanes, older fleets etc.





#### COP27

The IMO anticipates a possible doubling of transport flows on the seas by 2050 – and technical solutions for decarbonization have not yet emerged. Pollution from shipping currently accounts for 3% of global greenhouse gas emissions (GHG)

If the sector does not initiate changes, emissions could rise to 17% by 2050.





  - Safety Management in port areas.
- 2 Accident management pillar:
  - Response techniques for accidents involving hazardous material in port facilities and on ships;
  - Major crisis management
  - Best practices through incident analysis and lessons learned
