Background

The event will; i. showcase a regional climate mobility initiative unfolding in the Pacific, and ii. call upon the support of Asia Pacific partners and member states to help progress this work.

Pacific Island Countries are on the frontlines of climate change as they face varying threats from sea level rise to increasingly severe and frequent storms that adversely impact every part of life, exacerbate poverty and inequalities, and increasingly drive human mobility. International legal conventions and frameworks however do not adequately address the legal, cultural and social consequences of climate change and disaster-related mobility.

Through Pacific Climate Change Migration and Human Security (PCCM-HS) **programme**, four UN agencies, together with the Pacific Island Forum Secretariat (PIFS) and the Platform on Disaster Displacement (PDD) are jointly supporting Pacific Island countries and territories to develop a regional framework on climate mobility. This joint initiative has leveraged the partner agency's diverse expertise and networks working in the field of climate change and climate mobility.



The development of the draft regional framework is a strong working example of member states working in concert to promote a regional approach, guided by a Joint Working Group co-chaired by the Governments of Fiji and Tuvalu.

Key outcome

A better understanding of the Pacific climate mobility context among Asia-Pacific member states, the PCCMHS programme objectives and the importance of and an identification of potential support to further and progress the Pacific climate mobility initiative.
