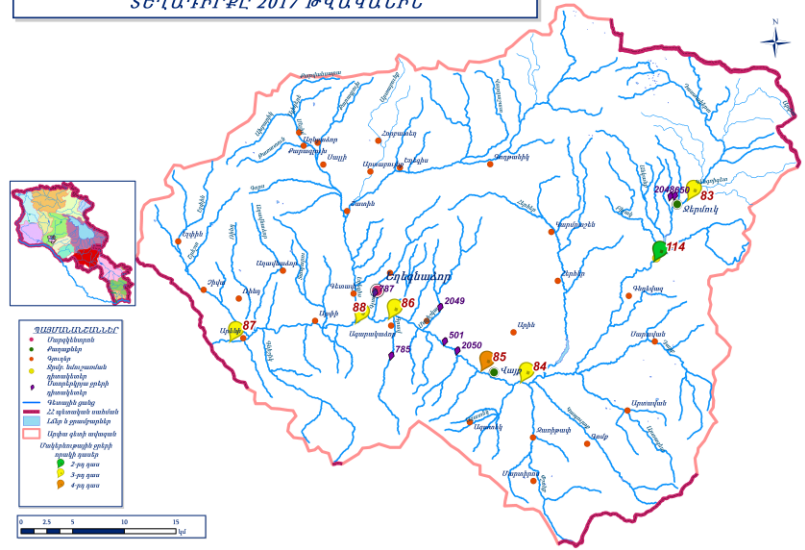

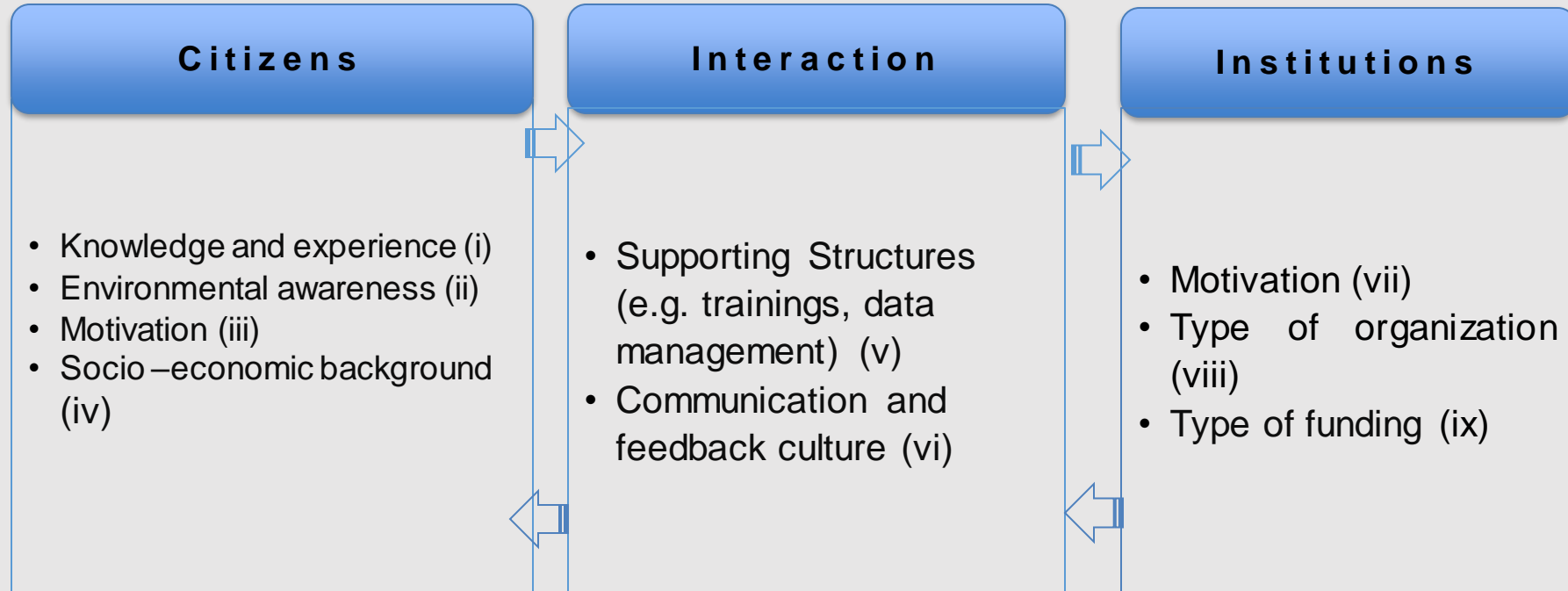

The design sets in the water quality monitoring. Source: Capdevila et al. (2020)



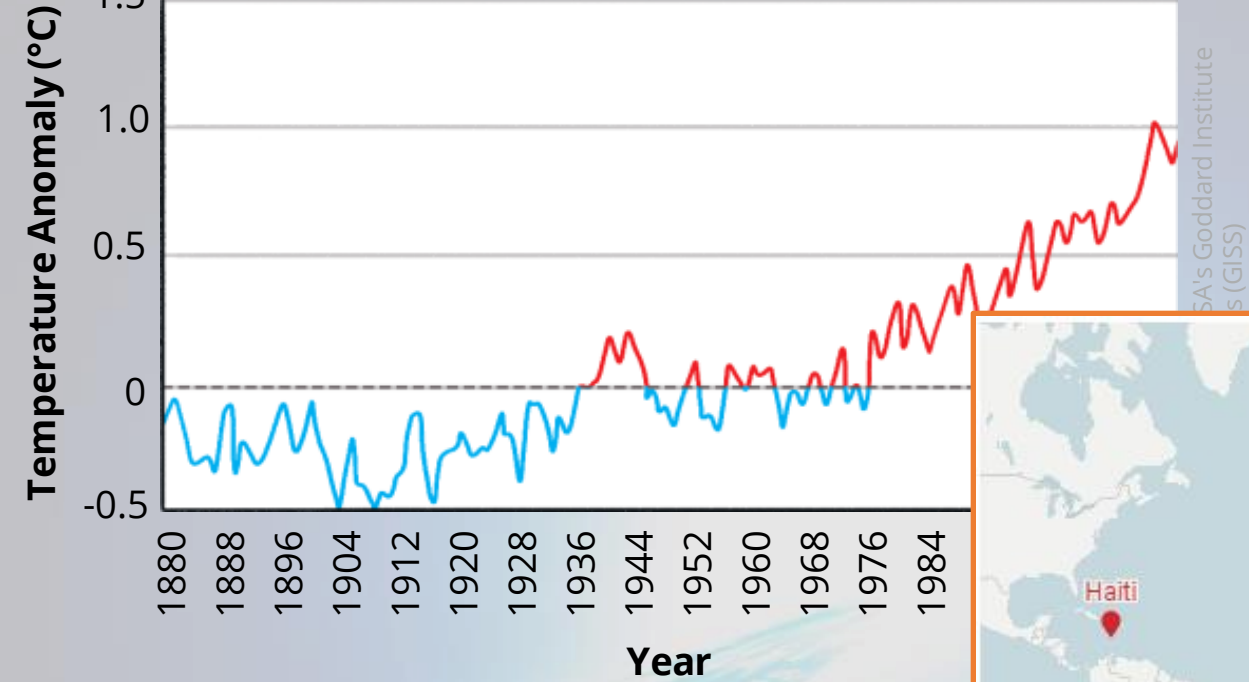
Over millions of years, species have adapted to survive in the conditions in which they live.

If the climate changes rapidly, organisms will not have enough time to adapt to the new conditions and may no longer be able to survive.

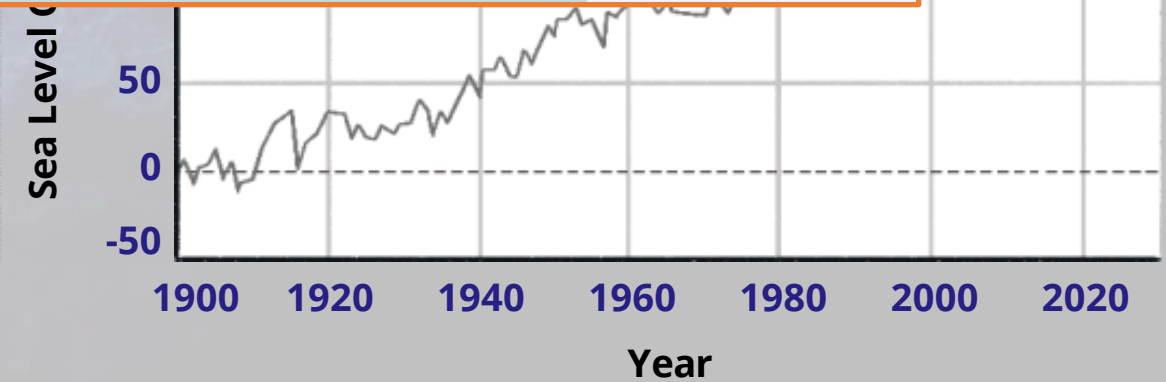
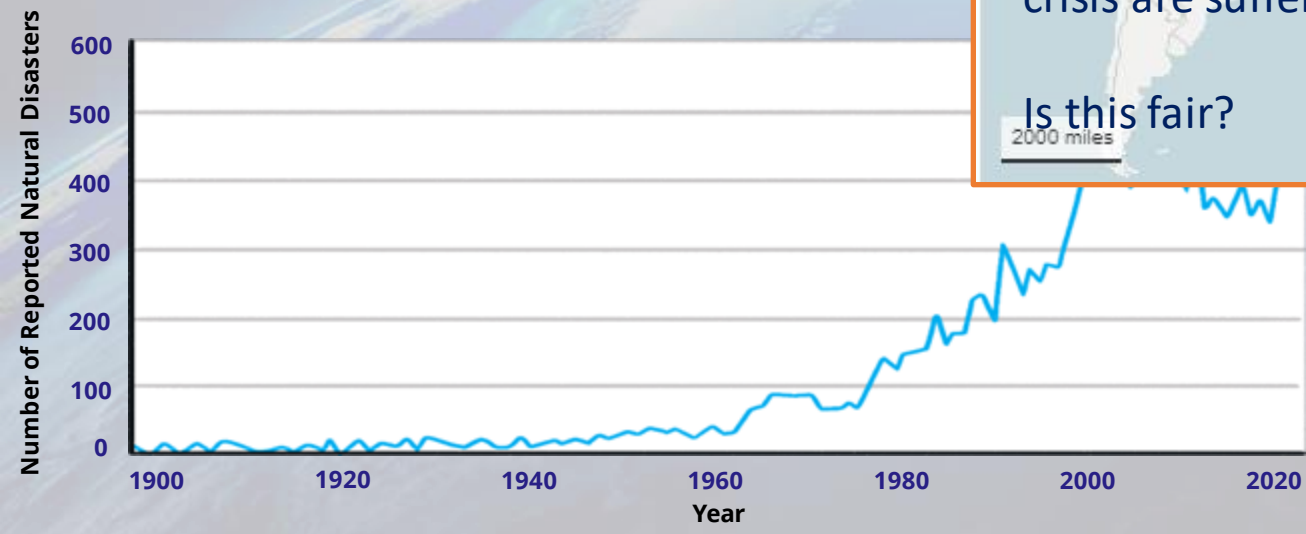

The countries that have contributed the least to the climate crisis are suffering the most.

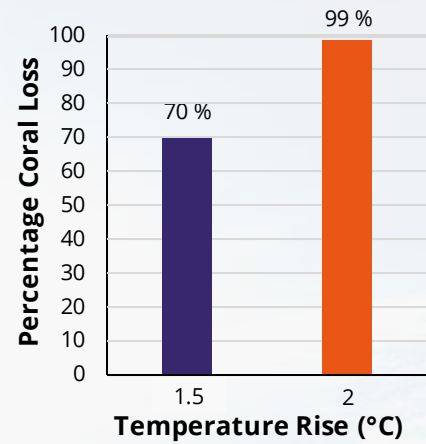

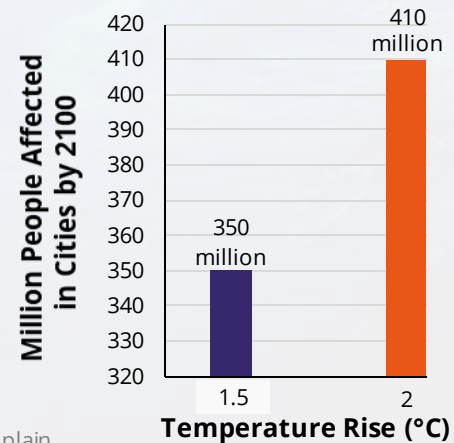

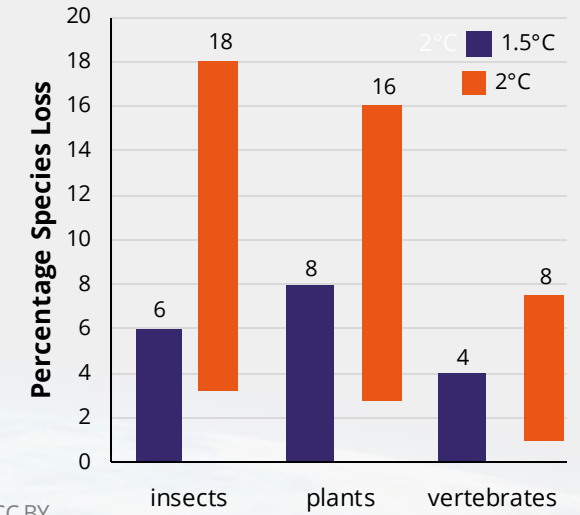

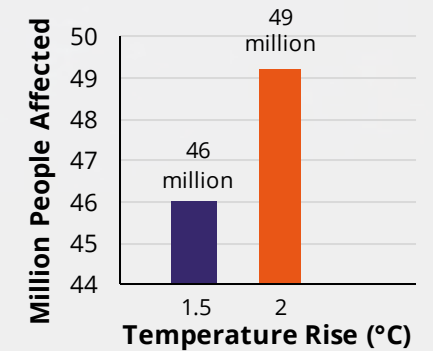
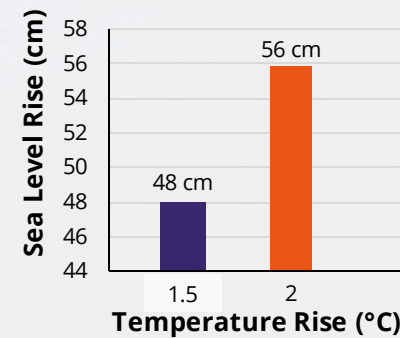
Species Loss
