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Current Situation

- The promise of UN Member States to **Leave No One Behind** lies at the heart of the 2030 Agenda and is fundamental to ensuring that the benefits of sustainable development are experienced by all.
- In Asia and the Pacific, prior the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, an estimated **233 million people** lived in extreme poverty, below the international poverty line of \$1.90 a day.
- Those living in extreme poverty as well as those who endure **disadvantages or deprivations** that limit their choices and opportunities relative to others in society are left behind.

- Access to key **services and opportunities** should be universal.



- Individual circumstances should **NOT** impact access.

Example of our Work: Leave No One Behind Platform

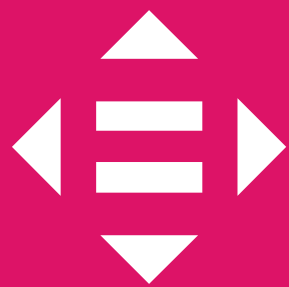
LNOB Platform is a diagnostic tool to help policy makers identify the most disadvantaged groups and to design policies that reduce inequality

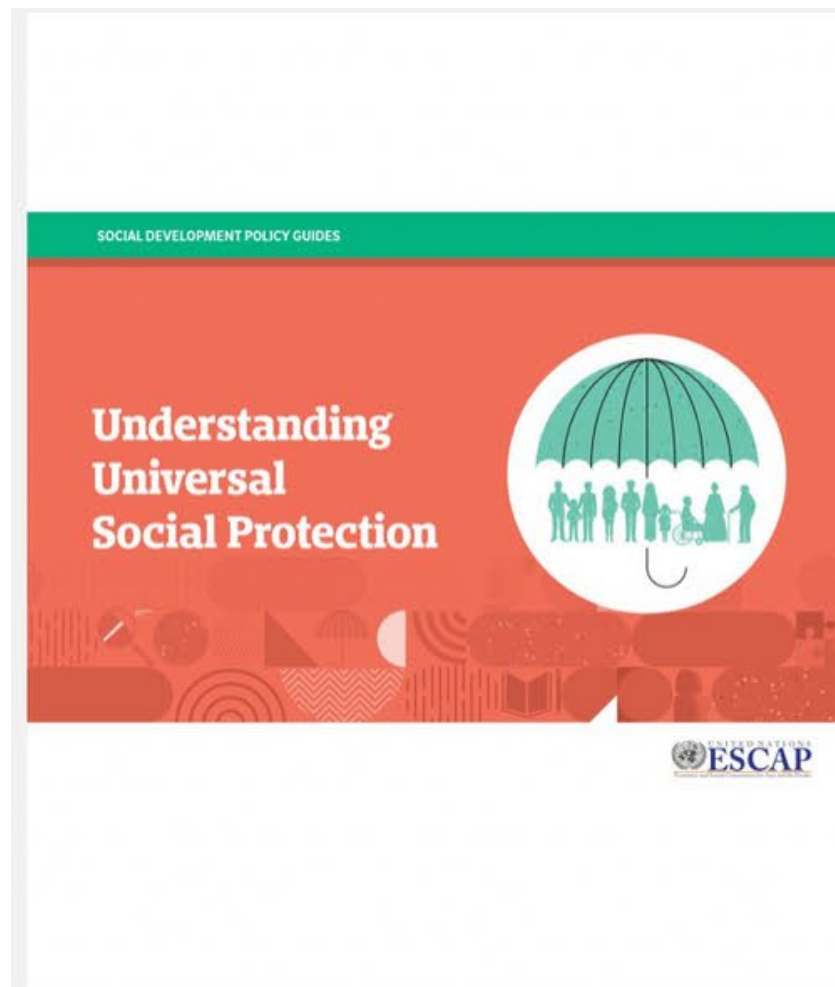
Example of our Work: Social Protection Simulator



- The simulator estimates how social protection can reduce poverty and inequality.
- Users can explore different social protection policy options and their costs through simulating the impact of one scheme in one country.
- Users can also combine multiple schemes in one country or compare similar schemes across different countries.



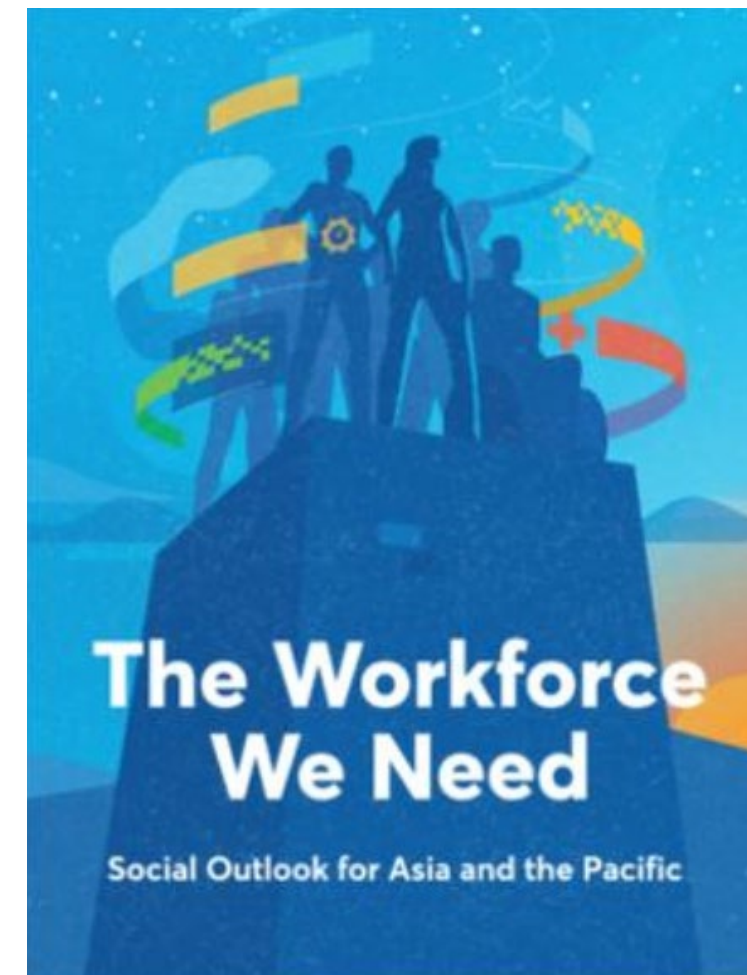

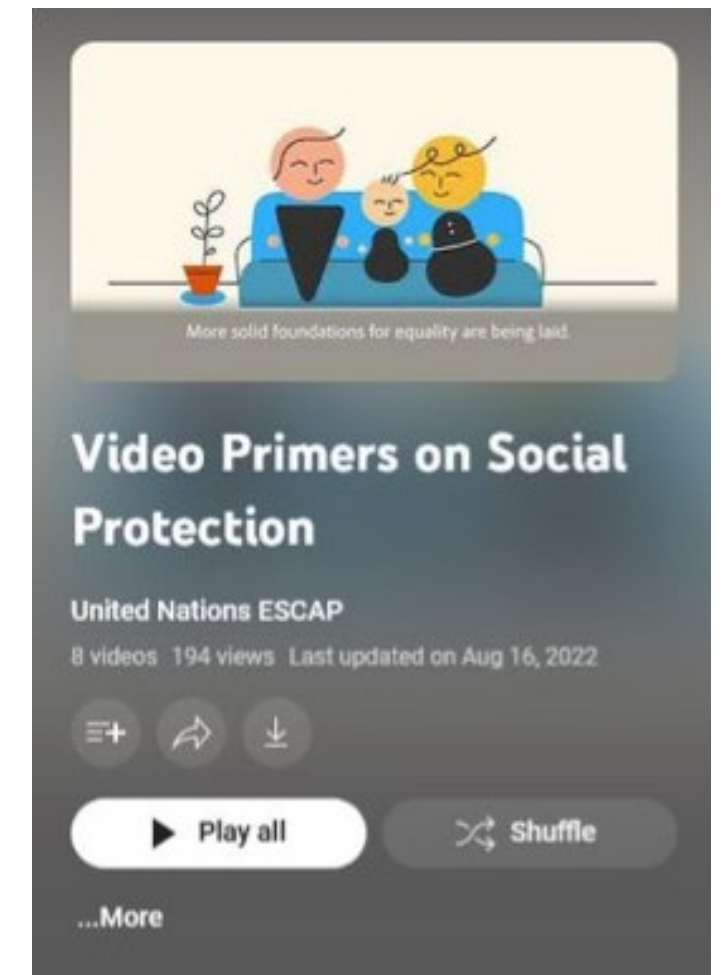
