

UN Development System reforms

Repositioning the UN development system to meet the ambition of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (GA resolution 72/279)

- Phase 1: optimize functions and enhance collaboration at regional and sub-regional levels
- Provide options, region-by-region, for longer term reprofiling and restructuring of regional assets of UN to ECOSOC in 2019

A new generation of **UN Country Teams**



Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (GA resolution 70/1)

Paragraph 76

We will support developing countries, particularly African countries, least developed countries, small island developing States and landlocked developing countries, in strengthening the capacity of national statistical offices and data systems to ensure access to high-quality, timely, reliable and disaggregated data.

We will promote transparent and accountable scaling-up of appropriate public-private cooperation to exploit the contribution to be made by a wide range of data, including earth observation and geospatial information, while ensuring national ownership in supporting and tracking progress.


