WHAT IT IS

The Pacific Data Hub - Microdata Library is a central repository for Pacific Island statistical microdata, reports and documents. It is an online cataloguing and dissemination system of survey and census metadata and microdata.



WHAT IT DOES

The Pacific Data Hub - Microdata Library allows researchers to browse, search, compare, apply for access and download relevant survey and census information from the Pacific Islands region. It allows data producers to disseminate survey information in a secured environment, in compliance with policies and conditions of use.







Terms of Use

Limitations on access by approved users

- The Terms of Use recognise obligations common to the national laws of SPC member countries which have produced the original data and which protect the integrity of statistical sources, as well as any legal obligations specific to the Licensor, where they require researchers to sign a Confidentiality Declaration or Declaration of Secrecy before viewing any microdata.
- Microdata will not in any way be used for any administrative, proprietary or law enforcement purposes.
- Access to approved microdata is limited at all times to the Lead Researcher and other members of the research team listed in this request. No copies of these data can be made or shared with those beyond the organisation of the applicant.
- 4. The Lead Researcher will implement security measures to prevent unauthorised access to licensed microdata acquired from the Pacific Data Hub Microdata Library. The microdata approved for access, or any data created on the basis of the original data, will not be copied or made available to anyone other than those mentioned in the Data Access Agreement (DAA).
- \ Hub Microdata Library must be destroyed upon the completion of the research specified in the Data Access Agreement. Destruction of the microdata will be confirmed in writing to SPC by the Lead Researcher.
