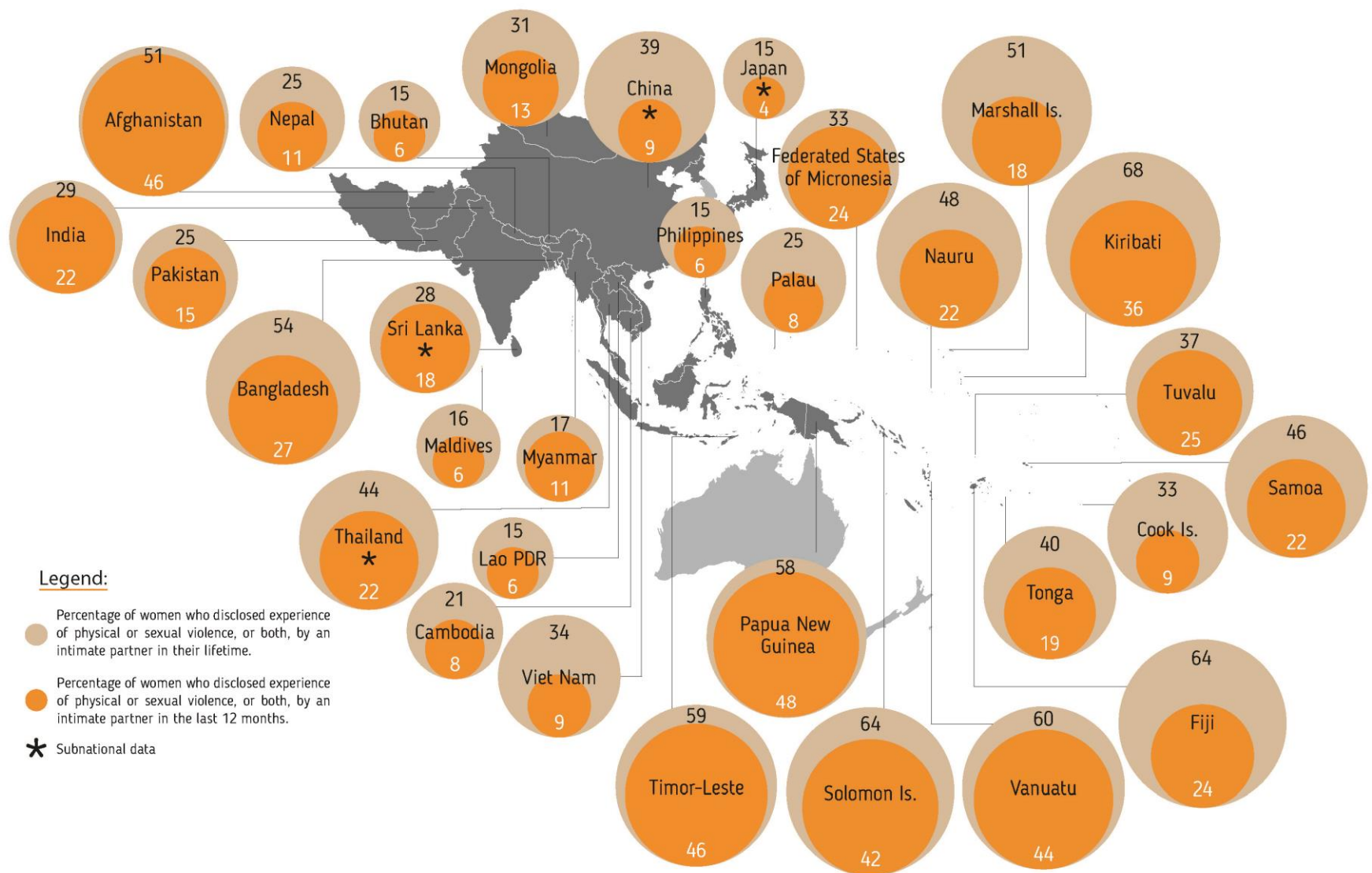

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN PREVALENCE DATA:

- Should be reliable, comparable & ethical
- Justify, inform & monitor effective, equitable prevention & response efforts
- Increasing demand due to Sustainable Development Goal 5 for Gender Equality
- Substantially lacking due to technical capacities

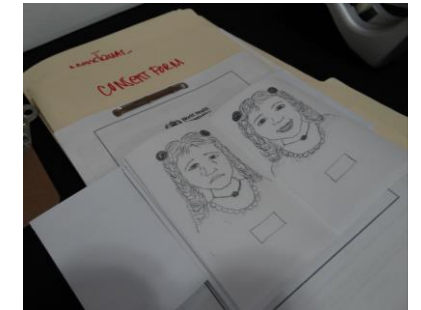
