Seventh Session of the Committee on Statistics 26-28 August 2020

10:00-13:00 hrs. (Bangkok time, GMT+7) (information as of 24 August 2020)

We are all learning

The seventh session of the Committee on Statistics will be a new experience for all of us. It is the first time the session will be virtual and to accommodate the virtual modality, the session has been reduced to a maximum of three hours per day. Time will be limited and we thank everyone in advance for their patience and understanding.

We seek your understanding also to make the meeting proceed as smoothly as possible. Country interventions will be limited to substantive agenda items only and we ask that you tailor country interventions to the issues for discussion. Country statements are encouraged to be submitted in writing in advance of the session and will be lodged as part of the meeting documentation.

An evaluation of the virtual modality will be undertaken to capture your feedback and recommendations for the eighth session of the Committee in 2022.

Virtual participation

The meeting will be conducted through the KUDO videoconferencing platform.

Given the technical limitations of conducting the Committee through a virtual platform and in view of the mandates and operational requirements of the Committee, priority will be given to the members, associate members and permanent observers of the Commission to deliberate on procedural matters.

Limited opportunities to deliberate on procedural matters will be available for observer organizations, intergovernmental organizations, other entities and non-governmental organizations.

All participants who wish to observe the proceedings may do so via a broadcast on the Committee website. Details of the broadcast will be made available in due course.

Letter of credentials, online registration and speakers list

As advised in the invitation letter of 23 April and subsequent update on 7 July, each delegation is required to submit a **letter of credentials**, duly signed by the appropriate authority of the respective Government, at the latest by 10 August. Only accredited delegates will be recognized in the list of participants.

In addition to submitting a letter of credentials for the delegation, each delegate in the delegation is required to **register online** as soon as possible before 10 August at https://meetings.unescap.org/. Only registration of accredited delegates will be accepted.

Each delegation is also requested to complete the speakers list request form to identify which members of the delegation will have a speaking role during the session. Members and associate members of the Commission can nominate up to three speakers. Permanent observers of the Commission, observer organizations, intergovernmental organizations, other entities and non-governmental organizations can nominate one speaker each. Delegations are requested to complete the speakers list request form and submit it to stat.unescap@un.org as soon as possible before 10 August 2020.

Delegates who wish to be present in the United Nations Conference Centre are welcome to join the event in ESCAP Hall. However, due to the current COVID-19 pandemic and the need for physical distancing, the conference room can accommodate up to 50 delegates only. Furthermore, as the session will be conducted virtually through the KUDO platform, delegates who have a speaking role and wish to be present in the conference room need to be on the delegation list, registered and nominated as speaker. Delegates who wish to be present in the conference room only (i.e. no speaking role) need to be on the delegation list and registered. In order to reserve seats in the conference room, please indicate your preference in the letter of credentials. The reservation is on first-come first-served basis.

Country Interventions and Statements

Since the virtual session will run for only three hours per day, time for interventions under each agenda item is limited. For the most part, the Committee will consider substantive issues brought for endorsement or action by the Committee, or for attention by subsidiary bodies of the Committee. These are Agenda items 2(b), 3(a), 4(a), 4(b) and 4(c). Country interventions focused on the substantive issues for consideration in these agenda items are welcome. Statements and issues shared for the general information of the Committee will be considered only if time allows. Country interventions and statements are encouraged to be submitted in writing in advance of the session and will be posted on the session website.

Documents and Interpretation

Pre-session documents are available in Chinese, English, French and Russian and are available on the documents page of the Committee website.

Given the technical limitations of conducting the Committee on Statistics in a virtual manner and in view of the mandates and operational requirements of the Committee on Statistics, the report of the Committee on Statistics will contain only four sections: organizational matters, decisions taken, the outcomes of electronic consultations and reference to Chair's summary. A Chair's Summary will be prepared to record the proceedings of the Committee and will be annexed to the report after the conclusion of the session.

The report, in all languages, will be available on the Committee website, following the second day of the session, for consideration by the Committee on the third and final day of the session at least one hour before the adoption of the report.

The KUDO videoconferencing platform provides live simultaneous interpretation in the four official languages of the Committee. Details on how to choose the interpretation service will be provided in the KUDO user guide.

Decisions

The Committee will deliberate on five substantive items, adoption of the agenda, election of a new Bureau and adoption of the report. Details on the deliberations under each agenda item are provided in the section below.

In light of the truncated format of the session, consultation on decisions are being undertaken in advance through electronic consultations conducted during July-August 2020.

The draft decisions from the electronic consultations will be presented for consideration and adoption by the Committee under agenda item 8. The deliberations during the virtual session on 26-28 August 2020 will be summarized as the Chair's Summary and will attached to the final report as an Annex.

Day 1: 26 August 2020 (10:00-13:00h, Bangkok time, GMT+7)

Agenda item 1 of the provisional agenda includes (a) opening addresses; (b) election of officers; and (c) adoption of the agenda.

The session will be opened at 10 a.m. Bangkok time (GMT+7) by the Chair of the sixth session of the Committee on Statistics, who will also deliver a statement highlighting key work of ESCAP since the Committee last met in October 2018.

The Chair will also preside over the election of officers of the seventh session.

In line with its rules of procedure and usual practice, the Committee will elect, from among its members, a Chair, three Vice-Chairs, one rapporteur and one member for the session.

Following the election of officers, the Chair of the seventh session will present outcomes of the advance electronic consultation on the provisional agenda of the session for

adoption. After the agenda is adopted, the Chair will invite the Executive Secretary to deliver her welcome and policy address.

The Chair may also invite pre-recorded messages and statements from distinguished guests, if time allows and pre-recorded messages and statements are available.

After opening of the session, the Chair will invite the Executive Secretary and distinguished delegates to launch the United Nations Statistical Institute for Asia and the Pacific (UNSIAP) 50th Anniversary book.
